California's CalAIM Enhanced Care Management (ECM) program offers Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) an opportunity to tap into additional revenue streams while serving vulnerable populations and improve health outcomes.


# What is CalAIM ECM?

With this additional funding stream, FQHCs can provide their highest-need Medi-Cal-enrolled patients an added layer of support by coordinating health, community, and social services at no additional cost to the patient1.






